14th IDSFFK CONCLUDED SUCCESSFULLY



14th International Documentary and Short Film Festival Kerala (IDSFFK) opened on 26 August in Trivandrum concluded on 31 successfully. A.K.A directed by Geetika Narang Abbasi (photo above) won the award for the Best Long Documentary. The film is based on the lives of three stars lookalike body doubles who work in Hindi Cinema. Little Wings produced by Naveen Mu won the award for the Best Short Film. Best Short Documentary award was shared between My Son and His Grandfather by Bijoy Choudhury and New Classroom by Debankon Singh Solanky. The Second-Best Long Documentary award won by Ladies Only directed by Rebana Liz John and the Second-Best Short Documentary award went to the Hindi film Party Poster. The Leopard's Tribe by Miriam Chandy Menacherry won Special Mention. Pradip Kurbah's Path won the Second-Best award in the Short Fiction category. The Malayalam film Parable of Tommy won a Special Mention in this category. The Bouyant by Arun AR, Akhilesh KA and Ananthu Krishna won the award for the Best Campus Film. Milind Chhabra, Jyoti Garhewal Lazar and Shobhit Jain received the Kumar Talkies award for the Best Editing in a Long Documentary, instituted by Editor Pankaj Rishikumar in memory of his father. Chief Minister Pinaravi Vijayan conferred the awards to the winners in the closing ceremony on 31 August.

The Jury composed of Sudipto Acharyya, Kivini Shohe and Cherian Joseph declared the awards. Satyajit Ray Golden award for the Best Documentary was given to If Memory Serves Me Right by Rafeeq Ellias, Silver award for the 2nd Best Documentary jointly to Ripples Under The Skin by Farha Khatun and My Son And His

Grandfather by Bijoy Chowdhury, and Bronze award for the 3rd Best Documentary to *Premalatha : A Video Portrait* by Suranjay & Hiranmayee Dasgupta. Ritwik Ghatak Golden award for the Best Short Fiction went to *Wagro* by Sainath Uskaikar, Silver award for the 2nd Best Short Fiction to *Raavi* by Jasmine Kaur Roy, Bronze award for the 3rd Best Short Fiction to *Smile Please* by Bakul Matiyani. Mrinal Sen Golden award for the Best Direction in Documentary was given to Farha Khatun for *Ripples Under The Skin*, and V Shantaram Golden award for the Best Direction in Short Fiction to Jasmine Kaur Roy for *Raavi*. FIPRESCI AWARD IN MOTOVUN FILM FESTIVAL

FIPRESCI International Critics Award in the 25th Motovun Film Festival (26-20 July 2022) was given to the film *The Sacred Spirit* (Espíritu sagrado) by Chema García Ibarra (Spain, 2021). The Jury composed of Tim Lindemann (Germany), Marko Stojiljković (Slovenia), and Midhat Ajanovic (Croatia) followed the films in the International Competition.

DRIVE MY CAR WON FIPRESCI GRAND PRIX

Drive My Car, directed by Ryûsuke Hamaguchi, won the FIPRESCI Grand-Prix as the Best Film of 2022 voted by the members of the International Federation of Film Critics, FIPRESCI. The vote had the participation of 646 critics from all over the world. The FIPRESCI Grand-Prix will be presented on 16 September at the opening gala of the 70th San Sebastian Festival.





FIPRESCI AWARD IN LOCARNO FILM FESTIVAL

FIPRESCI Award in the 76th Locarno Film Festival (2-12 Aug 2022) was given to the film *Stone Turtle* by Ming Jin Woo (Malaysia, Indonesia, 2022). The Jury composed of Dana Linssen (The Netherlands), Martin Horyna (Czech Republic), Müge Turan (Turkey), Peter Kremski (Germany), and Sarah Stutte (Switzerland) said in their citation that the film "offers a multiplicity of perspectives on urgent themes such as

violence against women, the question of who has a right to citizenship and the way we deal with our natural environment. This is a film that truly inspired us through its multilayered whirlwind of perceptions and sensibilities".

CASTELLORIZO DOCUMENTARY FESTIVAL

FIPRESCI Award in the Castellorizo - Beyond Borders International Documentary Festival (Greece 21–28 Aug 2022) was given to Village *of Women* by Tamara Stepanyan (Armenia, France, 2019). The Jury composed of Vasileios Kechagias (Greece), Janet Baris (Turkey), and Pablo García Conde (France) followed long documentaries
