# SIGNS 2023 CONCLUDED WITH JOHN ABRAHAM NATIONAL AWARDS



SiGNS is a pioneering festival in India for digital videos with a competition for short fiction and documentaries for the coveted John Abraham National Award instituted by the Kerala Region of the Federation of Film Societies of India to pay tribute to the maestro who was the guiding spirit behind radical initiatives for people's cinema. Like previous years, in this edition also the festival emphasized on the issues like state oppression, human rights, environment, gender equality, social and cultural identity by showcasing a total 123 films in different sections from 20 to 23 Feb 2023 at the EVM Cinema at Perumbavoor in Kerala. During the closing ceremony the 16th John Abraham National Awards were given to the following films: Best Short Fiction – *Path* by Pradip Kurbah, Best Documentary – *Trans Kashmir* by Surabhi Dewan & S A Hanan, Best Film on Cinema of Resistance – *In A Dissent Manner* by Ehraz Asmaduz Zaman, Best Film on Cinema Experimenta – *A Season of Mangoes* by Ishan Sharma, FFSI Award for Best Malayalam Short Fiction – *Since Forever* by Nisam Asaf, FFSI Award for Best Malayalam Documentary – *Black & White* by Manilal, Jury Mention for Documentary – *Ruuposh* by Mohd Fehmeed & Zeeshan Amir Khan, and Jury Mention on Cinema Experimenta – *Can They Hear Our Songs?* by Mehdi Jahan. The awards

included a citation, a trophy and a cash amount of Rs.50,000/- each for the best short fiction and best documentary, Rs.25,000/- each for the best cinema of resistance and cinema experimenta, and Rs.10,000/- each for the best Malayalam short fiction and documentary. The Jury was composed of Ashok Rane, Anomaa Rajakaruna, and Babu Kambrath. On this occasion the 4th FFSI Vijaya Mulay Lifetime Achievement Award 2023 was also conferred to Premendra Mazumder. Earlier



recipients of this coveted award were Aruna Vasudev (2020), Chelavoor Venu (2021), and Amrit Gangar (2022). The award installed by FFSI Keralam to pay tribute to Vijaya Mulay (16 May 1921 – 19 May 2019), the pioneer leader of the film society movement in India, includes a citation, a trophy and a cash amount of Rs.50,000/-

FIPRESCI Prize at the 12th Luxor African Film



FIPRESCI Prize at the 12<sup>th</sup> Luxor African Film Festival has been awarded to the film *Gazing at the Stars* (Simin Zetwal) by David Constantin (Mauritius, 2022, 93 mins). The Jury consisting of Massimo Lechi (Italy), Nadjibou Sagna (Senegal), and Mohamed Sayed Abdel Rehim (Egypt) in their citation said that the award is given to the film 'For its beautifully crafted and surprisingly original cinematic depiction of the complex cultural mosaic of the Mauritian society'.

FIPRESCI Prizes awarded to the following films:

The Survival of Kindness (2023, Australia, 96 mins) by Rolf de Heer in the Main Competition category with the citation: "It's a film made with a deep sense of understanding of cinematic art, clearly standing out in the competition by dealing with dystopia in a fresh and strong way to bring across a political message against racism and colonization".





Here (2023, Belgium, 82 mins) by Bas Devos in the Encounters section with the citation: "This quiet ballad draws our attention to the rhizomatic connections that exist around us but often go unnoticed. The composition is skillfully orchestrated, and the camera is often static. When the camera does move, it moves at a human pace and with a gentle fluidity, unhurried and serene. As two individuals with distinct backgrounds and life experiences observe mosses in the forest together, almost meditatively, they traverse a shared here and now, transcending all human-made boundaries that permeate our world. A thought-provoking exploration that is both metaphorical and philosophical, and a visual delight".

The Quiet Migration (Stille Liv, 2023, Denmark, 102 mins) by Maléne Choi in the Panorama section with the citation: "The Danish film The Quiet Migration is

awarded for its exquisite cinematography depicting solitude and alienation and the sensitive portrayal of the inner life of its protagonist, blurring the lines between reality and his imagination".

Between Revolutions (Intre revolutii, 2023, Romania, Croatia, Iran, Qatar, 68 mins) by Vlad Petri in Forum section with the citation: "Petri's second feature film is a documentary. Following the correspondence of two




women who lived in different regimes in the 70s and 80s, the film shows similarities and differences between Iran and Romania. Between Revolutions' poetic approach leaves space for interpretation; combined with the well-edited material, it unfolds in all its force".

Along with the FIPRESCI award, the prize of the Europa Cinemas was also announced: İlker Çatak's *The Teachers' Lounge* (Das Lehrerzimmer) won the Europa Cinemas Label as Best European film in the Panorama section.


