HONG KONG FILM FESTIVAL

FIPRESCI prize in 48th Hong Kong International Film Festival (28 March - 8 April 2024) awarded to the film *A Journey in Spring* (Taiwan, 2023, 90 min) by Peng Tzu-Hui and Wang Ping-Wen. The jury composed of Alexander Melyan (Armenia), Héctor Llanos (Spain), and Ho Ar Nam (Hong Kong) in their citation said 'For leading the audience into their own experiences of separation and grief, while pursuing their own aesthetics'. Alexander Melyan

in his festival report published on the FIPRESCI website said "The most cinematically balanced, integral, and simply powerful film of the program turned out to be *A Journey in Spring* by Peng Tzu-Hui and Wang Ping-Wen. An elderly couple lives in a decaying, secluded house hidden in the wooded, mountainous outskirts of the invisible metropolis. Despite appearing estranged, the spouses are eternally bound, one cannot exist without the other. The details of their past remain undisclosed. Instead, their characters are revealed through simple observation and prolonged, static shots. Drawing inspiration from films of the New Taiwanese Wave (both actors have extensive experience working with directors like Tsai Ming-Liang and Hou Hsiao-Hsien), *A Journey in Spring* is a meditation on the topic of life, love, and loss."

VISIONS DU RÉEL FILM FESTIVAL

FIPRESCI prize in the 55th Visions du Réel Film Festival, Nyon, Switzerland, (12-21 April 2024) awarded to *(Y)our mother* (Belgium, France, 2024, 96 min) by Samira El Mouzghibati. The jury composed of Calin Boto (Romania), Petra Meterc (Slovenia), and Samer Angelone (Switzerland) watched the first or second feature film presented in the



International Feature Film Competition or the Burning Lights Competition. The film tells the story of Samira, the youngest of five sisters, who calls her family together, camera in hand, for a rare meeting. Their mother remains silent until she arrives in her native village to reveal her secrets, her regrets and strength, and the profound bond and legacy that unite them, between love and rejection.



ZAGREB INT. DOCU FESTIVAL

FIPRESCI prize in 20th Zagreb Dox International Documentary Film Festival, Croatia (14-21 April 2024) awarded to *KIX* (Hungary, France, Croatia, 2024, 92 min) by Dávid Mikulán and Bálint Révész. The jury composed of Hamed Soleimanzadeh (Iran), Milena Zajović (Croatia), and Igor Angjelkov (Macedonia) in their citation said "For its creative process of discovering the hidden life of street kids, the brave approach to understanding the new generation's

complexes, unique way of storytelling about actions and consequences, stunning editing, and brilliant cinematography, but also the visceral portrayal of the class inequalities and the subtle recognition of the rise of populism in the European societies". (PC: FIPRESCI)

ISTANBUL INT. FILM FESTIVAL

FIPRESCI prize in the Istanbul International Film Festival, Turkey, (17-28 April 2024) awarded to Forever-Forever (Ukraine, The Netherlands, 2023, 107 min) by Anna Buryachkova, Hesitation Wound (Turkey, 2023, 84 min) by Selman Nacar, and Children of the White Mountain (Turkey, 2023, 20 min) by Yalcin Ciftci. The jury composed of Paola Casella (Italy), Géza Csákvári (Hungary), Sezen Sayinalp



(Turkey), Nino Kovacic (Croatia), Valentina Giraldo Sánchez (Colombia), and Selin Gürel (Turkey) presented three awards, to a film in the international competition, and to a long and a short film in the national competition. Set in Kyiv in the late 1990s, *Forever-Forever* is an unsettling portrait of the young and rebellious as they navigate love, explore their sexuality, and play cruel games, which never have a winner. Violence, sex and love among Ukrainian youth – are brought to a life in this fast-paced exciting film.



GOEAST INTL. FILM FESTIVAL

FIPRESCI prize in 24th goEast International Film Festival, Wiesbaden, Germany, (24-30 April 2024) awarded to *KIX* (Hungary, France, Croatia, 2024, 92 min) by Dávid Mikulán and Bálint Révész and *Plague* (Russian Federation, 2022, 87 min) by Dmitrii Davydov. The jury composed of Bojidar Manov (Bulgaria), Katrin Hillgruber (Germany), and Catalin Olaru (Romania) [in pic: PC- FIPRESCI] in their citation said, the International Critics Prize for a fiction film in International Competition has been presented to *Plague* "For its impeccable framing, the uncompromising view of violence

as a personal incentive in a male-dominated society, and the inventive way in which it applies Western movie dynamics to a rural landscape never before associated with this particular genre". The jury also said that the International Critics Prize for a documentary film in International Competition has been presented to *KIX* for "It began ten years ago with a chalk line. The documentation of two unsupervised boys in Budapest and their actions between pranks and street art has become a testimony to social sensitivity and anarchic joie de vivre and thus a cinematic stroke of luck".

60 YEARS OF CHARULATA

KOLKATA FILM ACADEMIA (KOFA) - a joint initiative of 'Chitra-Bani' and 'Federation of Film Societies of India' celebrated 60 Years of Ray-classic *Charulata* (released on 17th April 1964) on 17th April 2024 at Chitra-Bani auditorium in Kolkata with a shot-wise analysis of the film by the eminent filmmaker and film academician Sekhar Das. Joseph presented the session (pic). On this occasion, KOFA also paid tribute to the legendary art-director Bansi Chandragupta on his birth centenary (1924-2024).

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
4TH ONLINE FILM APPRECIATION COURSE 2024


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E-CINEINDIA VOL.XXI PUBLISHED
