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FIPRESCI-INDIA CONFERRED SATYAJIT RAY AWARD TO MAITHILI RAO



FIPRESCI-India conferred the 4th Satyajit Ray Memorial Award for the Outstanding Contribution to Writing on Cinema 2024 to Maithili Rao. The award, announced earlier on Ray's birth anniversary (2 May), handed over to Maithili Rao by the master director Girish Kasaravalli on 7 March 2025 at the main venue of

the 16th Bengaluru International Film Festival (1-8 March 2025) followed by a seminar on Film Criticism - Challenges, Opportunities, Emerging Platforms, and Points of Review organized by FIPRESCI-India in collaboration with the School of Film, Media and Creative Arts, RV University, Bangalore. Girish Kasaravalli introduced the seminar by mentioning Satyajit Ray's contributions in propagation of film culture. He also focused on Maithili Rao's contributions to writing on cinema. Maithili Rao delivered the keynote address while Prof. N. Manu Chakravarthy, Dr Pranjal Bora, Dr Piyush Roy, and Vedant P took part as the panellists. N. Vidyashankar moderated the program, chaired by V.K. Joseph.

FIPRESCI AWARD IN BENGALURU INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL

FIPRESCI Prize in 16th Bengaluru International Film Festival (1-8 March 2025) awarded to *Humans in the Loop* (India, Hindi, 2024, 72 min) directed by Aranya Sahay. FIPRESCI International Jury composed of Pranjal Borah (India), Pierre-Simon Gutman (France) and Nino Kovacic (Croatia) in their motivation said: 'The film manages to question both the traditions and the new technologies,



putting in perspective, through the use of AI, identity issues in a new technological age that pretends to be neutral. It's a very local story, and a very global one at the same time,



a testament to the fact that a highly personal and grounded vision will always be, in some way, universal.' The film also won the Best Film Award in the Indian Cinema Competition section Chitra Bharati. Best Kannada Film Award won by Prithvi Gopal Konanur for his film Mikka Bannada Hakki. Chief Minister of Karnataka Siddaramaiah conferred the

Lifetime Achievement Award to Shabana Azmi for her outstanding contributions to cinema. The Award consists of a certificate, and a cash amount of Rs.10 lakhs.

(Greece), and Dieter Wieczorek (France) in their motivation for *Free Leonard Peltier* in the International Competition said: 'For highlighting the imperative of sustained resistance against a judicial system that is not only unjust but also corrupt, particularly in its neglect of marginalized lives and minority communities'.

award Golden Pyramid in Cairo International Film Festival 2024, Best Director Award in IFFI Goa 2024, Orizzonti Award for Best Film and FIPRESCI Prize in Venice Film Festival 2024, Grand Prix and FIPRESCI Prize in Luxembourg City Film Festival 2025.

FIPRESCI Prize in 37th Rencontres de Toulouse – CinéLatino, France, 21-30 March 2025 awarded to the film *A House with Two Dogs* by Matías Ferreyra (Argentina, 2025, 98 min). The jury was composed of Belit Lago (Spain), Georgios Papadimitriou (Greece), and Luis Vélez (Peru). The film is a distrustful portrait of a family in crisis from a child's point of view.

FIPRESCI Prize in 29th Sofia International Film Festival Bulgaria, 13-31 March 2025 awarded to film *Windless* by Pavel G. (Bulgaria, Italy, 2024, 93 min). masterfully conveys the complexity of human isolation and emotional turbulence into a striking cinematic achievement. Its stillness – and emphasis on what goes unsaid – transforms it into an evocative reflection of internal and external stasis that is well deserving of the FIPRESCI Prize'.

The visual cinematic techniques employed are authentic, refined, and unique, inviting viewers into personal moments of memory and the chance to discover an entire new universe of vision.'
